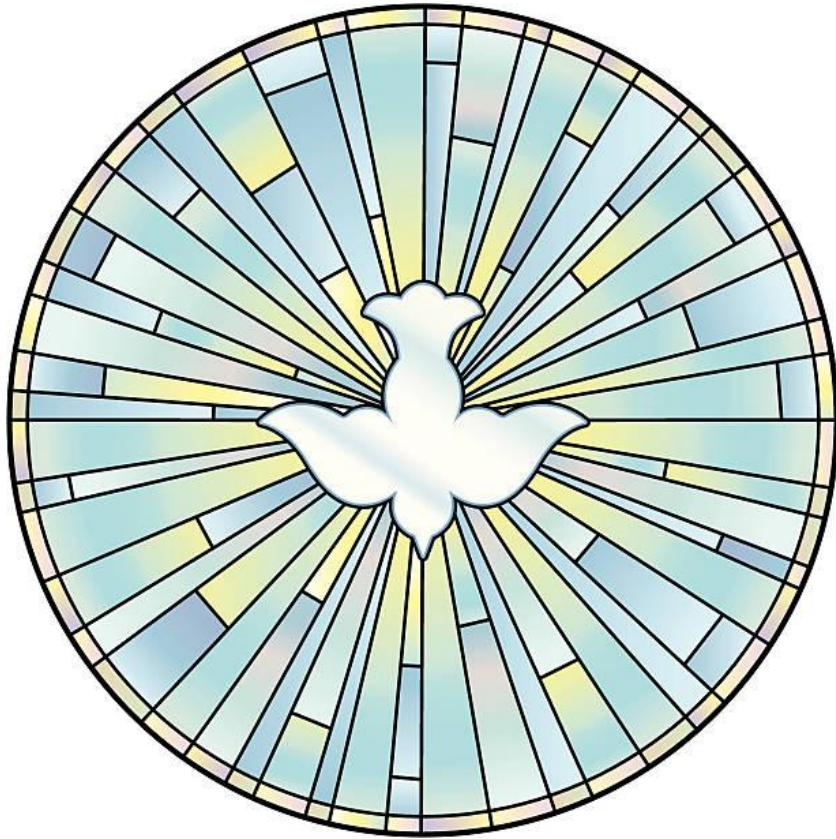

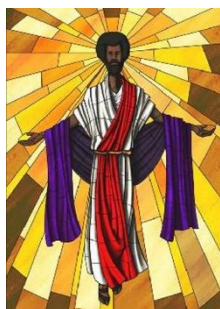

- Have regular checkups and follow medical advice.

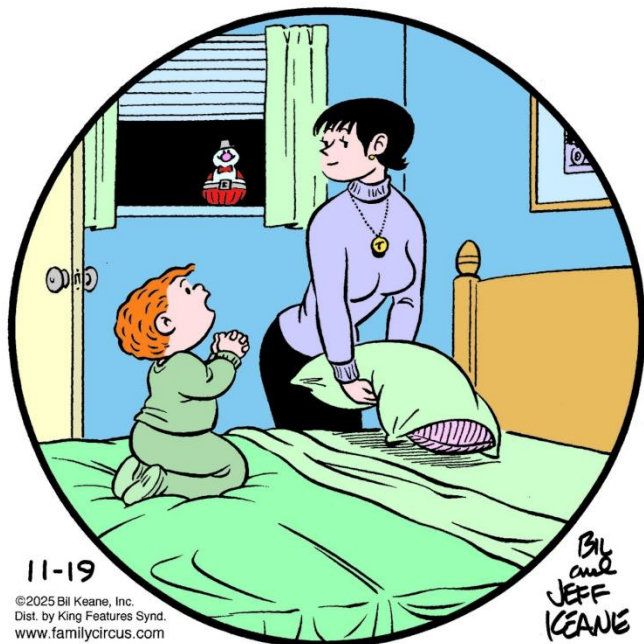

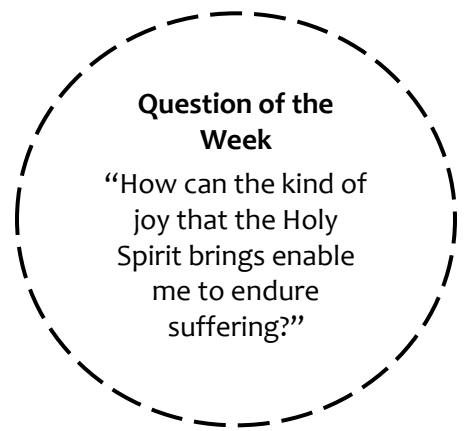
