Saint of the Week

St. Peter Claver: Spanish Jesuit priest who dedicated his life and ministry, to caring for enslaved Africans in port city of Cartagena, Columbia. Born in Spain and later joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1601. He boarded slave ships to tend to the sick slaves and visited plantations to advocate for humane treatment. Fr. Claver personally baptized over 300,000 enslaved people. Canonized in 1888. His feast day is September 9th

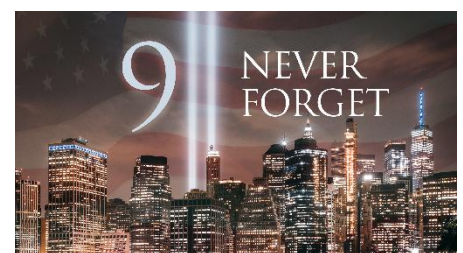
